Chapter 1

Preface

1. Brief History of SI&PF Department

The State Insurance and Provident Fund Department was established in Rajasthan as a welfare measure with a view to provide economic & social security to all the employees of the Government of Rajasthan. At present the department is running Life Insurance scheme for all the state government employees, General Provident Fund scheme , Rajasthan Government Health Scheme and Mukhyamantri Aayushman durghatna bima yojna.

In 1991, the department entered into General Insurance Business to provide coverage to the property of State Government departments, Statutory Bodies viz. Boards, Corporations, Co-operative societies and Registered Institutions etc. in which the government has substantial financial interest by way of shareholder or a loanee, against Fire, Motor, Marine & Miscellaneous risks.

The SI&PF Department is therefore, authorized to provide the General Insurance services by the license No. 572 dated 26.05.1992 issued by the Government of India.

At present various General Insurance coverages are provided by this department like: Fire Insurance, Marine Insurance (In Land Transit Road/Rail), Motor Insurance, Miscellaneous Insurance, Burglary & House Breaking, Money Policy, Fidelity Guarantee Policy, Workmen's Compensation Policy (Act), Group Personal Accident Policy, Erection Policy, Machinery Breakdown Policy, Boiler - Explosion Policy, Contractor's All Risk Insurance etc. as part of the insurance work carried out by the department.

2. About Mukhyamantri Mangla Pashu Bima Yojna

In the Modified Budget of 2024-25, The Rajasthan Government announced **Mukhyamantri Mangla Pashu Bima Yojna (MMPBY)** worth 400 crores for the year 2024-25.

The aim of MMPBY is announced to protect the interest of the farmers and strengthening their economic well being through insurance of their valuable cattle

The Government proposes to undertake to cover 5,00,000 milch Cows, 5,00.000 milch Buffalos, 1,00,000 Male or female Camels, 5,00,000 female Goats and 5,00,000 female sheep. The selection will be based on the lottery criteria.

One big animal will be considered as one cattle unit and 10 small animals (sheep/goat) will be considered as one cattle unit.

3. Implementation of the scheme

The scheme will be implemented by the State Insurance & Provident Fund, General Insurance Fund (SI& PF) Department known as the Procuring Entity through a Service Provider known as **Base Line Survey Agency (BSA)** successful bidder.

4. Objective of the Scheme

The objective of the scheme is the management of risk and uncertainties related to the life of the animals i.e., cow, buffalo, Camels and goat/sheep by providing a protection mechanism to the Livestock Owners against any eventual loss of their cows and buffaloes or other insured animals due to natural or accidental death and to provide the benefit of compensation of livestock to the owner of the livestock.

For the purpose of insurance the healthiest animal with highest milking capacity will taken up for benefit under the scheme.

5. Geographical Scope/Coverage of the Scheme:

The Mukhyamantri Mangla Pashu Bima Scheme will be implemented in all the Districts of the Rajasthan with the requisite infrastructural framework as required.

6. Animals/Livestock verification:

The Scheme shall cover any Two milch cow / buffalo or ten sheep / goat or one camel(male/female) of the selected beneficiary, through the lottery, further, it is clarified that the benefit of insurance is restricted to only Two milch cow / buffalo or ten sheep / goat or one camel(male/female) per household. The data of the selected beneficiary, selected through the lottery system will be uploaded on the portal provided by the department. The uploaded data will be verified by the Base line survey agency during the survey. The same data can be used at the time of Insurance or in case of any mishap (settlement of the claims). The BSA will cover the beneficiaries for the purpose of Insurance as per the guidelines provided.

7. Valuation and age of the Animal to be insured:

The valuation and age of the animal will be assessed as per the given tables in the presence of:

- · The beneficiary
- · A registered veterinary practitioner.
- The Agency representative

In case of any difference of opinion at the time of valuation, the decision of the veterinary doctor, present at the site, will be final and binding.

9. Payment of Insurance in the event of death of the beneficiary:

In the event of death of the beneficiary benefits under the policy will be continued in the name of the nominee of the beneficiary. For claims after the death of the beneficiary, the claim shall be settled in favor of the nominee of the beneficiary.

10. 12 Digit Uid Number- of The Milch Animal:

The animal insured will have to be properly and uniquely identified at the time of verification. The Animals selected during the lottery will be verified at site, with their tag numbers and Jan-aadhar card of the beneficiary if the tag number of animal mismatch then BSA correct the tag number at the time of the registration. If the tag is lost after the registration, then re-tagging done by the BSA at the time of Insurance.

11. Man-power Requirement:

The successful bidder shall provide sufficient manpower in order to ensure that the MMPBY is implemented successfully in the state and base line survey is conducted as expeditiously as possible. The deployment of manpower will be jointly and amicably decided by SI&PF department and the BSA.

12. Dividing Work among More Than one Bidder:

The division of work, in case of more than one successful bidder, if required, then, will be the sole discretion of SI&PF Department which is the Procuring entity, at the matching rate of L-1 according to the provisions Rule 74 of RTPP Rules 2013.

13. Loss of Ear Tag:

In case of loss of ear tag due to any reason, the beneficiary/owner of the animal shall immediately inform to the BSA for re-tagging. The retagging will be done by the concerned representative of the BSA and information of the lost tag will be mentioned in the data collected and uploaded on the portal for transparency.

14. Extension Clause:

The rate contract shall be extendable to a maximum of as per RTPP Act 2012, Rules 2013, if needed, on mutually agreed terms and conditions between the Procuring Entity and the Service Provider/successful bidder. The extension clause of the Rate Contract under RTPP Act 2012, Rule 2013 shall apply to this bid/rate contract.

15. Right to Vary Quantity:

The Procuring entity shall reserve its right to increase or decrease the quantity/value of the subject matter in consonance as per RTPP Act 2012, Rules 2013.

- 4. Bidder shall submit their offer/bid on-line in electronic formats both for technical and financial proposal through e-procurement portal.
- 5. In case, any of the bidders fail to submit the Tender Fee, Bid Security and RISL Processing Fee up to the date and time as mentioned in RFP, its Bid shall not be considered. The requisite fee(s) are to be paid online via E-Gras through single e-challan.
- 6. The Procuring Entity will not be responsible for delay in online submission due to any reason. For this, bidders are requested to upload the complete bid documents well in advance, so as to avoid the last-minute issues like slow speed; congestion in website due to heavy load or any other unforeseen problems.
- 7. Bidders are also advised to refer "Bidders Manual Kit" available at e-Procurement website for further details about the e-Tendering process.
- All Pre-Bids shall be opened in the office of the Director, State Insurance and Provident Fund, General Insurance Fund, Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur in the presence of the Bidders or their representatives who wish to be present.
- 9. 4. Information from the bidder

Any change in the constitution of the firm, etc. shall be notified forth with by the contractor in writing to the procuring entity and such change shall not relieve any former member of the firm, etc., from any liability under the contract.

No new partner/ partners shall be accepted in the firm by the selected bidder in respect of the contractunless he/ they agree to abide by all its terms, conditions and deposits with the procuring entity through a written agreement to this effect. The bidder's receipt for acknowledgement or that of any partners subsequently accepted as above shall bind all of them and will be sufficient discharge forany of the purpose of the contract.

5. sub-letting of the contract:

The selected bidder shall not assign or sub-let his contract or any substantial part thereof to any other agency without the permission of procuring entity.

6. Disqualification of a Bidder, if any time it is found that :-

8. Disclosure of conflict of interest

Chapter-3

Bid Document

1. Cost & Language of Bid

a) The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the procuring entity shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

b) The Bid, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid exchanged by the Bidder and the procuring entity, shall be written only in English Language. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Bid may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English/ Hindi language, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bid, such translation shall govern.

2. Deadline for the submission of Bids

- a) Bids shall be received online at e-Procurement portal and up to the time and date specified in the NIB.
- b) Normally, the date of submission and opening of Bids would not be extended But, only inexceptional circumstances or when the bidding document are required to be Substantially modified as a result of discussions in pre-bid meeting/ conference or otherwise and the time with the prospective bidders for preparation of Bids appears insufficient, the date may be extended by the procuring entity.

In such case the publicity of extended time and date shall be given in the manner, as was given at the time of issuing the original NIB and shall also be placed on the State Public Procurement Portal, if applicable.

It would be ensured that after issue of corrigendum, reasonable time is available to the bidders for preparation and submission of their Bids. The procuring entity shall also publish such modifications in the bidding document in the same manner adopted as the publication of initial bidding document.

c) If, in the office of the Bids receiving and opening authority, the last date of submission or opening of Bids is a non-working day, the Bids shall be received or opened on the next working day.

3. Changes in the Bid Document

a) At any time, prior to the deadline for submission of Bids, the procuring entity may for any reason, whether on its own initiative or as a result of a request for clarification by a bidder, modify the bidding documents by issuing an addendum in accordance with the provisions of the RTPP Act 2012 and Rules 2013.

b) In case, any modification is made to the bidding document, or any clarification is issued which materially affects the terms contained in the bidding document, the procuring entity shall publish such modification or clarification in the same manner as the publication of the initial bidding document.

c) In case, a clarification or modification is issued to the bidding document, the procuring entitymay, prior to the last date for submission of Bids, extend such time limit in order to allow the bidders sufficient time to take into account the clarification or modification, as the case may be, while submitting their bids.

d) Any bidder, who has submitted his bid in response to the original invitation, shall have the opportunity to modify or re-submit it, as the case may be, within the period of time originally allotted or such extended time as may be allowed for submission of Bids, when

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changes are made to the bidding document by the procuring entity:

e) Provided that the Bid last submitted, or the Bid as modified by the bidder, shall be only considered for evaluation.

4. Opening of Bids

- a) The Bids shall be opened by the bid opening & evaluation committee on the date and time mentioned in the NIB in the presence of the bidders or their authorized Representatives.
- b) The committee shall prepare a list of the bidders, or their representatives attending the opening of Bids and obtain their signatures on the same. The list shall also contain the representative's name and telephone number and corresponding bidders' names and addresses. The authority letters, if any, brought by the representatives shall be attached to the list. The list shall be signed by all the members of Bid opening committee with date and time of opening of the Bids.
- c) All the documents comprising of technical Bid/ cover shall be opened & downloaded from the e-Procurement website (only for the bidders who have submitted the prescribed fee(s) to the entities mentioned in the NIB.
- d) The committee shall conduct a preliminary scrutiny of the opened technical Bids to assess the prima-facie responsiveness and ensure that the: -
 - 1. Bid is accompanied by bidding document fee, bid security and processing fee (if applicable);
 - 2. Bid is valid for the period, specified in the bidding document.
 - 3. Bid is unconditional and the bidder has agreed to give the required performance security; and
 - 4. Other conditions, as specified in the bidding document are fulfilled.
 - 5. Any other information which the committee may consider appropriate.
- e) No Bid shall be rejected at the time of Bid opening except the Bids not accompanied with the proof of payment or instrument of the required price of bidding document, processing fee andbid security.
- f) The Financial Bid cover shall be kept unopened and shall be opened later on the date and time intimated to the bidders who qualify in the evaluation of technical Bids.

5. Withdrawal, Substitution, and Modification of Bids

- a) A Bidder may withdraw its Bid or re-submit its Bid (technical and/ or financial cover) as per the instructions/ procedure mentioned at e-Procurement Website. Bidders are also advised to refer "Bidders Manual Kit" available at e-Procurement website for further details about the e-Tendering process
- b) Bids once withdrawn shall not be opened/processed or reconsidered further.

6. Selection Method

The selection method is the lowest price (L-1 method).

In the event the more than one bidder quotes the same lowest price, then the bid securing the highest technical ground will be adjudicated as the best value Bid.

7. Format and Signing of Technical and financial Bids

- a) Bidders must submit their bids online at e-Procurement portal i.e. http://eproc.rajasthan.gov.in or http://sppp.rajasthan.gov.in,.
- b) All the documents uploaded should be digitally signed with the DSC of authorized signatory.
- c) A Single stage- two part/ cover system shall be followed for the Bid: -
 - ☐ Technical Bid, including fee details, eligibility & technical documents of the bidder ☐ Financial Bid

8. Clarification of Bids

To assist in the examination, evaluation, comparison and qualification of the Bids, the bid evaluation committee may, at its discretion, ask any bidder for a clarification regarding its Bid. The committee's request for clarification and the response of the bidder shall be through the e-Procurement portal.

Any clarification submitted by a bidder with regard to its Bid that is not in response to a request by the committee shall not be considered.

No change in the prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to confirm the correction of arithmetic errors discovered by the committee in the evaluation of the financial Bids.

No substantive change to qualification information or to a submission, including changes aimed at making an unqualified bidder, qualified or an unresponsive submission, responsive shall be sought, offered or permitted.

9. Determination of Responsiveness

- The bid evaluation committee shall determine the responsiveness of a Bid, ensuring the requirements of the bidding document and that it is without any material deviation, reservation, or omission and meets all the provisions of pre-qualification/ eligibility criteria of the bidding document.
- The bid evaluation committee may request the bidder to submit the necessary
 information or document like audited statement of accounts/ CA Certificate, Registration
 Certificate, VAT/ CST/GST clearance certificate, Registration Certificate of PF and
 ESIC etc. within a reasonable period of time. Failure of the bidder to comply with the
 request may result in the rejection of its Bid.



Chapter - 4

1. Scope and work of BSA

- The BSA will be responsible for collection of survey related information from concerned beneficiary and upload it on the portal within stipulated time.
- Complete the work assigned for the purpose of successful functioning, implementation and supervision of the scheme.

2. Base Line Survey

- a) Verifying the data of the registered family.
- b) Explaining to the beneficiary the scope and nature of the scheme.
- c) Collection of the required documents from the beneficiary.
- d) After successful verification of the required documents and information uploading the same on the portal through Geo synchronized app.
- e) In case of any dispute of data collection the same shall be intimated to the SI&PF Department.
- f) Submit a report on day-to-day basis of the data collected.
- g) Storage of all the information collected in electronic format and sharing of the same with the SI&PF Department.
- h) Co-ordinating with the veterinary doctor for his availability during the survey.
- i) Ensuring the photograph of the animal, Fitness Certificate of the animal and other specification as per the scheme and application requirement.
- j) Tagging of the animal, where necessary.
- k) Correction of tag number / Lakhpati Didi Card no / Gopal Card no. if required.

3. Documents for data processing and its collection.

Duties of BSA:

- a) Collect and upload Photographs (3 Nos.) (Photograph of the Tag along with tagging the animal, Beneficiary with the Jan-Aadhar card, photograph of the beneficiary with the animal)
- b) Ensure availability of the Veterinary Doctor and the beneficiary at the time of survey and issuing the health certificate of the animal,
- c) Check details of the Beneficiary, other documents etc as per the policy requirement.
- d) Ensure to check if the animal is also insured from any other agency through any other government scheme and mention the same in the collection data information.

4. At the time of the death of the animal:-

a. The baseline survey agency will ensure to visit the beneficiary within 24 hours, when the insured animal of the beneficiary dies. During this visit, he will coordinate with the veterinary doctor to conduct the postmortem of the dead animal and ensure uploading the postmortem report, photographs and other details as per the requirement.

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- b. After the postmortem is conducted, BSA will ensure uploading of three photographs comprising of:-
 - 1. Complete photo of dead animal with tag and the beneficiary
 - 2. Postmortem photo and
 - 3. Beneficiary with the Insurance Policy
- c. He will also match all the details of the beneficiary as were given by the beneficiary during the baseline survey. He will also ensure collecting the tag of the dead animal.

6. Waiting Clause

There will be a waiting clause of 21 days in case of natural death of the animal. But, in case of any death due to accident / natural calamities / fire incident / thunder storm / electric current shock / poisonous snakes bite / poisonous insect bite / consuming poisonous grass and leaves by the animal there will be no waiting clause.

7. Data collection Procedure and its processing

- a) Collection of the Data on the app provided by the SI&PF department
- b) checking the details of the animal and the beneficiary as per the result of the lottery
- c) The data collection will be done on Geo synchronized method
- d) Visiting the beneficiary house hold
- e) Verifying the beneficiary details.
- f) Physical verification of the animal which is to be insured.
- g) Ensuring that the insured animals are as per the policy requirement...
- h) Ensuring that the animals selected for insurance are fit in health and are not suffering from any disease.
- i) Getting the health certificate issued by the veterinary doctor in his presence.

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8. Activities to be under taken by BSA

- a) The BSA shall set up a separate office in Jaipur to provide BSA services to SI&PF(GIF) department.
- b) The BSA shall maintain a helpdesk at the office of the Additional Director (GIS) and a representative of the BSA shall be available on the helpdesk during working hours of the office. The representative managing the helpdesk shall provide daily update on
 - 1) Insurance done
 - 2) Death claims received and postmortem done
- BSA shall provide a telephone help line, the cost of which shall be borne bythe BSA.
- d) The BSA shall submit a monthly report by e-mail / hard copy to the SI&PF office. A bi-weekly meeting of BSA Project Heads with Additional Director GIS will be held to analyze the day to day working of BSA.
- e) In case the data given to BSA does not comply with the requirement and is not sufficient for the purpose of BSA services, the BSA will intimate the same to the Authority.

Chapter-5

Payment Terms, Schedule and Penalties

1. Payment Terms, Schedule

- a) The payment to the selected bidder/ BSA shall be based on the rate approved for the contract by the Government.
- b) The rate approved for the contract is the yearly cost and same shall be paid to the Agency on quarterly basis after deduction of penalty & taxes as applicable and after successful completion of the work.
- c) Invoices to be raised quartely, along with progress report, by the selected bidder/BSA upon completion of required work. All payments shall be made based on work completed and approved by MMPBY office.
- d) The BSA will provide all reports required under the project on monthly, quarterly, half yearly and yearly basis for MMPBY.
- e) Any delay by the BSA on the deliverable(s) or in submitting the required information to the Department shall not account for the delay on Department's part.
- f) The selected bidder/BSA's request for payment shall be made to the department in writing, accompanied by invoices describing the services delivered and associated performances pursuant to general conditions of the contract and upon fulfillment of all the obligations stipulated in the Contract, due payments shall be made by the department after examining of the invoice or request for payment by the selected bidder/BSA.
- g) The currency or currencies in which payments shall be made to the selected bidder/BSA under this Contract shall be Indian Rupees (INR) only.
- h) In case of disputed items, the disputed amount shall be with-held and will be paid only after settlement of the dispute.
- Any penalties/ liquidated damages, as applicable, for delay and non-performance, as mentioned in this bidding document, will be deducted from the payments.
- Taxes, as applicable, will be deducted at the time of the payment / paid as per the prevalent rules and regulations
- k) No Advance Payments of any kind shall be made to BSA

2. Penalty Terms & Conditions

- a) The selected bidder/ BSA is expected to dispose all survey related works within given stipulated time from day of allotment of the contract. If BSA fails in delivering the required services due to reasons attributable to him i.e., delay in disposal of services within defined timeframe, the cumulative penalty, as applicable, would be imposed while processing the payment for respective quarter..
- b) The total penalty, if any, in any quarter shall be deducted from the total amount due for the quarter.



- c) The penalty clause will not be applicable for the first quarter, except for the office set up (per office) of the contract period. The first quarter shall be considered as settling period for the BSA. But if, any penalty is imposed on an officer of the department under Rajasthan Public Service Guarantee Act - 2011 or by any other court and cause of penalty is delay caused by BSA, the same shall be charged from BSA.
- d) All penalty & Taxes will be applicable as per the provisions of the RTPP act 2012 and RTPP rules 2013
- e) The penalty amount will be calculated based on the defined time frames as mentioned below

f) Imposition of penalties amounting to 10% of the contract value for a continuous period of 2 quarters shall be treated as non-performance and beyond which the tendering authority may initiate action for the termination of the Contract and may also forfeit the PSD. The tendering authority may also debar the Selected Bidder from bidding (for all types and form of bids) for at least three years in GoR.

3. Forfeiture of Security Deposit:

Security amount in full or part may be forfeited, including interest, if any, in the following cases:

- When any terms and condition of the contract is breached.
- When the bidder fails to make complete supply satisfactorily.

1. Bid Security / Performance security

Every bidder, if not exempted, participating in the procurement process will be required to furnish thebid security as specified in the NIB.

- a) Prior to execution of agreement, Performance security shall be solicited from all successful bidders except the departments of the State Government and undertakings, corporations, autonomous bodies, registered societies, co-operative societies which are owned or controlled or managed by the State Government and undertakings of the Central Government. However, a performance security declaration shall be taken from them. The State Government may relax the provision of performance security in particular procurement or any class of procurement.
- b) Bid security instrument or cash receipt of bid security or a bid securing declaration shall necessarily accompany the technical bid.
- c) The Bid security to be deposited through e-gras
- d) Bid security of a bidder lying with the procuring entity in respect of other bids awaiting decision shall not be adjusted towards bid security for the fresh bids. The bid security originally deposited may, however, be taken into consideration in case bids are re-invited.
- e) The bid security may be given in the form of a banker's cheque or demand draft or bank guarantee, in specified format, of a scheduled bank. The bid security must remain valid thirty days beyond the original or extended validity period of the bid.
- f) The issuer of the bid security and the confirmer, if any, of the bid security, as well as the form and terms of the bid security, must be acceptable to the procuring entity.
- g) Prior to presenting a submission, a bidder may request the procuring entity to confirm the acceptability of proposed issuer of a bid security or of a proposed confirmer, if required. The procuring entity shall respond promptly to such a request.
- h) FDR may also be considered as the bid security amount if the FDR presented is in the name of the procuring entity. The same will only be considered on after the bidder furnishes an undertaking from the bank to make a premature payment of the FDR to the procuring entity without the requirement or the consent of the bidder. In the event of the forfeiture of the performance security, the FDR shall be forfeited along with the interest earned on such FDR.
- i) The bank guarantee presented as bid security shall be got confirmed from the concerned issuing bank. However, the confirmation of the acceptability of a proposed issuer or of any proposed confirmer will not preclude the procuring entity from rejecting the bid security on the ground that the issuer or the

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confirmer, as the case may be, has become insolvent or has otherwise ceased to be credit worthy.

- j) The bid security of unsuccessful bidders shall be refunded soon after final acceptance of successful bid and signing of Agreement and submitting performance security.
- k) The Bid security taken from a bidder shall be forfeited, including the interest, if any, in the following cases, namely: -
 - When the bidder withdraws or modifies its bid after opening of bids.
 - When the bidder does not execute the agreement, if any, after placement of supply/ work order within the specified period.
 - When the bidder fails to commence the supply of the goods or service or execute work as per supply/ work order within the time specified.
 - When the bidder does not deposit the performance security within specified period after the supply/ work order is placed; and
 - If the bidder breaches any provision of code of integrity, prescribed for bidders, specified in the bidding document.
- Notice will be given to the bidder with reasonable time before bid security deposited is forfeited.
- m) No interest shall be payable on the bid security / PSD.
- n) In case of the successful bidder, the amount of bid security may be adjusted in arriving at the amount of the Performance Security or refunded if the successful bidder furnishes the full amount of performance security.
- o) The procuring entity shall promptly return the bid security after the earliest of the following events, namely: -
 - The expiry of validity of bid security.
 - The execution of agreement for procurement and performance security is furnished bythe successful bidder.
 - The cancellation of the procurement process; or
 - The withdrawal of bid prior to the deadline for presenting bids unless the bidding documents stipulate that no such withdrawal is permitted.

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Chapter-7

Evaluation and Tabulation of Bids

1. Evaluations of Technical Bids

- The bids shall be tabulated in the form of a comparative statement to evaluate the qualification of the bidders as set in the bidding document.
- The number of firms qualified in technical evaluation, if less than three and it is considered
 necessaryby the procuring entity to continue with the procurement process, reasons shall be
 recorded in writing and included in the record of the procurement proceedings and may be
 referred to the higher committee.
- The bidders qualifying in the technical evaluation shall be informed in writing about the date, time, and place of opening of their financial Bids.

2. Tabulation of Technical Bids

- The Bids shall be tabulated in the form of a comparative statement to evaluate the qualification of the bidders against as set in the bidding document
- The members of bid evaluation committee shall give their recommendations for selection accordingly

3. Firms Qualifying in technical Bid:

- The number of firms qualified in technical evaluation, if less than three and it is
 considered necessary by the procuring entity to continue with the procurement
 process, reasons shall be recorded in writing and included in the record of the
 procurement proceedings and may be referred to the higher committee.
- The bidders who qualify in the technical evaluation shall be informed in writing about the date, time, and place of opening of their financial Bids.

4. Evaluation & Tabulation of Financial Bids

Subject to the provisions of "Acceptance of Successful Bid and Award of Contract" below, the procuring entity shall take following actions for evaluation of financial Bids: -

- The financial Bids of the bidders who qualified in technical evaluation shall be opened
 online at the notified time, date and place by the bid evaluation committeein the presence
 of the bidders or their representatives who choose to be present.
- The process of opening of the financial Bids shall be similar to that of technical Bids.
 - The names of the bidders, the rates given by them, and conditions put, if any, shall be read out and recorded.

Conditional Bids are liable to be rejected.

The evaluation data sheet shall include all costs and all taxes and duties applicable to the bidder as per law of the Central/ State Government/ Local Authorities, and the evaluation criteria specified in the bidding documents shall only be applied.

The offers shall be evaluated on lowest price (L-1) method.

It shall be ensured that the offer recommended for sanction is justifiable looking to the prevailing market rates of the goods, works or service that is required to be procured.

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5. Lack of competition

A situation may arise where, if after evaluation of Bids, the bid evaluation committee may endup with one responsive Bid only. In such situation, the bid evaluation committee would check as to whether, while floating the NIB all necessary requirements to encourage competition like standard bid conditions, industry friendly specifications, wide publicity, sufficient time for formulation of Bids, etc were fulfilled. If not, the NIB would be re-floated after rectifying deficiencies.

The bid process shall be considered valid even if there is one responsive Bid, provided that: -

- The Bid is technically qualified.
- The price quoted by the bidder is assessed to be reasonable. The Bid is unconditional and
 is complete in all respects.
- There are no obvious indicators of cartelization amongst bidders; and
- The bidder is qualified as per the provisions of pre-qualification/ eligibility criteria in the bidding document.
- The bid evaluation committee shall prepare a justification note for approval by the next higher authority of the procuring entity, with the concurrence of the account's member.
- In case of dissent by any member of bid evaluation committee, the next higher authority in delegation of financial powers shall decide as to whether to sanction the single Bid or re-invite Bids after recording reasons.
- If a decision to re-invite the Bids is taken, market assessment shall be carried out for estimation of market depth, eligibility criteria and cost estimate.

6. Acceptance of the successful Bid and award of contract

The procuring entity after considering the recommendations of the bid evaluation committee and the conditions of Bid, about the financial implications, trials, sample testing and test reports, etc., shall accept or reject the successful Bid. If any member of the bid evaluation committee has disagreed or given its note of dissent, the matter shall be referred to the next higher authority, as per delegation of financial powers, for decision.

Decision on Bids shall be taken within original validity period of Bids and time period allowed to procuring entity for taking decision. If the decision is not taken within the original validity period or time limit allowed for taking decision, the matter shall be referred to the next higher authority in delegation of financial powers for decision.

Before award of the contract, the procuring entity shall ensure that the price of successful Bid is reasonable and consistent with the required quality.

A Bid shall be treated as successful only after the competent authority has approved the procurement in terms of that Bid.

Prior to the expiration of the period of bid validity, the procuring entity shall inform the successful bidder, in writing, that its Bid has been accepted.

As soon as a Bid is accepted by the competent authority, its written intimation shall be sent to the concerned bidder by registered post or email and asked to execute an agreement in the format

givenin the bidding documents on a non-judicial stamp of requisite value and deposit the amount of performance security or a performance security declaration, if applicable, within a period specified in the bidding document.

If the issuance of formal letter of acceptance is likely to take time, in the meanwhile a **Letter of Intent(LOI)** may be sent to the bidder. The acceptance of an offer is complete as soon as the letter of acceptance or letter of intent is posted and/ or sent by email (if available) to the address of the bidder given in the bidding document. Until a formal contract is executed, the letter of acceptance or LOI shall constitute a binding contract.

The bid security of the bidders who's Bids could not be accepted shall be refunded soon after the contract with the successful bidder is signed and its performance security is obtained.

7. Procuring entity's right to accept or reject any or all Bids

The Procuring entity reserves the right to accept or reject any Bid, and to annul (cancel) the bidding process and reject all Bids at any time prior to award of contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the bidders.

Forfeiture of Security Deposit: Security amount in full or part may be forfeited, including interest, if any, in the following cases: -

When any terms and condition of the contract is breached.

When the bidder fails to make complete supply satisfactorily.

If the bidder breaches any provision of code of integrity, prescribed for bidders, specified inthe bidding document.

Notice will be given to the bidder with reasonable time before PSD deposited is forfeited. No interest shall be payable on the PSD.

8. Right to vary quantity

At the time of award of contract, the quantity of goods, works or services originally specified in the bidding documents may be increased as per the RTPP Act 2012, Rules 2013. It shall be without any change in the unit prices or other terms and conditions of the Bid and the bidding documents.

If the procuring entity does not procure any subject matter of procurement or procures less than the quantity specified in the bidding documents due to change in circumstances, the bidder shall not be entitled for any claim or compensation.

Repeat orders for extra items or additional quantities may be placed on the rates and conditions given in the contract. Delivery or completion period may also be proportionately increased. The limits of repeat order shall be as under: -

50% of the quantity of the individual items and 50% of the value of original contract in case of works; and 50% of the value of goods in case of services.

9. Performance Security

Prior to execution of agreement, Performance security shall be solicited from all successful bidders except the departments of the State Government and undertakings, corporations, autonomous bodies, registered societies, co-operative societies which are owned or controlled or managed by the State Government and undertakings of the Central Government. However, a performance security declaration shall be taken from them. The State Government may relax the provision of performance security in particular procurement or any class of procurement as it wishes.

10. Performance security shall be furnished in any one of the following forms: -

- Deposit through e-GRAS
- Bank Draft or Banker's Cheque of a scheduled bank.
- National Savings Certificates and any other script/ instrument under National Savings Schemes.
- Bank guarantee/s of a scheduled bank. It shall be got verified from the issuing bank. Other
 conditions regarding bank guarantee shall be same as mentioned in the bidding document
 forbid security.
- Fixed Deposit Receipt (FDR) of a scheduled bank. It shall be in the name of procuring entity on account of bidder and discharged by the bidder in advance. The procuring entity shall ensure before accepting the FDR that the bidder furnishes an undertaking from the bank to make payment/premature payment of the FDR on demand to the procuring entity without requirement of consent of the bidder concerned. In the event of forfeiture of the performance security, the Fixed Deposit shall be forfeited along with interest earned on such Fixed Deposit.

11. Forfeiture of Security Deposit:

Security amount in full or part may be forfeited, including interest, if any, in the following cases:

- When any terms and condition of the contract is breached.
- When the bidder fails to make complete supply satisfactorily.
- When the bidder breaches any provision of code of integrity, prescribed for bidders, specified in the bidding document.
- Notice will be given to the bidder with reasonable time before PSD deposited is forfeited.No interest shall be payable on the PSD.

12. Execution of agreement

A procurement contract shall come into force from the date on which the letter of acceptance or letter of intent is dispatched to the bidder.

The successful bidder shall sign the procurement contract within 15 days from the date on which the letter of acceptance or letter of intent is dispatched to the successful bidder.

If the bidder, who's Bid has been accepted, fails to sign a written procurement contract or fails to furnish the required performance security within specified period, the procuring entity shall take action against the successful bidder as per the provisions of the bidding document and Act. The procuring entity may, in such case, cancel the procurement process or if it deems fit, offer for

acceptance the rates of lowest bidder to the next lowest bidder, in accordance with the criteria and procedures set out in the bidding document.

The bidder will be required to execute the agreement on a non-judicial stamp of specified value at its cost and to be purchase from anywhere in Rajasthan only.

13. Confidentiality

Notwithstanding anything contained in this bidding document but subject to the provisions of any other law for the time being in force providing for disclosure of information, a procuring entity shall not disclose any information if such disclosure, in its opinion, is likely to: -

- Impede enforcement of any law
- Affect the security or strategic interests of India
- Affect the intellectual property rights or legitimate commercial interests of bidders

The procuring entity shall treat all communications with bidders related to the procurement process in such manner as to avoid their disclosure to competing bidders or to any other person not authorized to have access to such information.

In addition to the restrictions specified above, the procuring entity, while procuring a subject matter of such nature which requires the procuring entity to maintain confidentiality, may impose condition for protecting confidentiality of such information.

14. Cancellation of procurement process

If any procurement process has been cancelled, it shall not be re-opened but it shall not prevent the procuring entity from initiating a new procurement process for the same subject matter of procurement, if required.

A procuring entity may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, cancel the process of procurement initiated by it –

- · At any time prior to the acceptance of the successful Bid; or
- After the successful Bid is accepted:
- If the bidder who's Bid has been accepted as successful fails to sign any written
 procurement contract as required or fails to provide any required security for the
 performance of the contract, the procuringentity may cancel the procurement process.
- If a bidder is convicted of any offence under the Act, the procuring entity may: -
- Cancel the relevant procurement process if the Bid of the convicted bidder that has been declared as successful but no procurement contract has been entered into.

The procuring entity shall not open any bids or proposals after taking a decision to cancel the procurement and shall return such unopened bids or proposals.

The decision of the procuring entity to cancel the procurement and reasons for such decision shall be immediately communicated to all bidders that participated in the procurement process.

15. Offenses by Firms/Companies

Where an offence under "The Rajasthan Transparency Public Procurement Act 2012" has been committed by a company, every person who at the time the offence was committed was in charge of and was responsible to the company for the conduct of the business of the company, as

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well as the company, shall be deemed to be guilty of having committed the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

Provided that nothing contained in this sub-section shall render any such person liable for any punishment if he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he had exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

Notwithstanding anything contained in (a) above, where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company and it is proved that the offence has been committed with the consent or connivance of or is attributable to any neglect on the part of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall also be deemed to be guilty of having committed such offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

16. Debarment from Bidding

A bidder shall be debarred by the State Government if he has been convicted of an offence:

Under the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (Central Act No. 49 of 1988); or under the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act No. 45 of 1860) or any other law for the time being in force, for causing any loss of life or property or causing a threat to public health as part of execution of a public procurement contract.

A bidder debarred under (6.35.1) above shall not be eligible to participate in a procurement process of any procuring entity for a period not exceeding three years commencing from the date on which he was debarred.

If a procuring entity finds that a bidder has breached the code of integrity prescribed in terms of "Code of Integrity for bidders" above, it may debar the bidder for a period not exceeding three years.

Where the entire bid security or the entire performance security or any substitute thereof, as the case may be, of a bidder has been forfeited by a procuring entity in respect of any procurement process or procurement contract, the bidder may be debarred from participating in any procurement process undertaken by the procuring entity for a period not exceeding three years.

The State Government or a procuring entity, as the case may be, shall not debar a bidder under this section unless such bidder has been given a reasonable opportunity of being heard.

17. Termination for Default

The tender sanctioning authority of MMPBY may, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by a written notice of default of at least 30 days send to the selected bidder and may terminate the contract in whole or in part: -

If the bidder fails to deliver services within the time period specified in the contract, or any extension thereof granted under Mukhyamantri Mangla Pashu Bima Yojna (MMPBY); or

If the bidder fails to perform any other obligation under the contract within the specified period of delivery of service or any extension granted thereof; or

If the bidder, is found to be engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

If the bidder commits breach of any condition of the contract.

If MMPBY terminates the contract in whole or in part, amount of PSD may be forfeited.

Before cancelling a contract and taking further action, advice of senior most finance person available in the office and of legal adviser or legal assistant posted in the office, if there is one, may be obtained.

As on effective date of termination, Tendering Authority may pay:

The unpaid value of all the services given by the Bidder and accepted by the purchaser in accordance with the RFP specifications in order to take over the possession of the assets / application.

All the services delivered by the Bidder and accepted by the purchaser; the consideration payable shall be based on service rate as per agreement.

18. Termination for Insolvency

MMPBY may at any time terminate the Contract by giving a written notice of at least 30 days to the supplier/ selected bidder if the supplier/ selected bidder becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In such event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier/ selected bidder, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy that has accrued or will accrue thereafter to MMPBY.

19. Termination for Convenience

MMPBY office, by a written notice of at least 30 daysmay terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The Notice of termination shall specify that termination is for the Purchaser's convenience, the extent to which performance of the supplier/ selected bidder under the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

That on the expiry of this clause, the selected bidder and any individual assigned for the performance of the services under this clause shall handover or cause to be handed over all confidential information and all other related material in its possession, including the entire established infrastructure supplied by selected bidder to MMPBY.

That the products and technology delivered to MMPBY during the contract term or on expiry of the contract duration should not be sold or re-used or copied or transferred by selected bidder to other locations. Supplied hardware, software & documents etc., used by selected bidder for MMPBY shall be the legal properties of MMPBY.

Chapter-8

Exit Mechanism

1. Exit Management

The selected bidder shall provide MMPBY or its nominated agencies with a recommended exitmanagement plan ("Exit Management Plan") which shall deal with

- Aspects of exit management in relation to the Project Implementation, the Operation and Management.
- A detailed program of the transfer process that could be used in conjunction with a replacement operator including details of the means to be used to ensure continuing provision of the services throughout the transfer process or until the cessation of the services and of the management structure to be used during the transfer; and
- Plans for the communication with such of the selected bidder's, staff, suppliers, customers and any related third party as are necessary to avoid any material detrimental impact on MMPBY operations as a result of undertaking the transfer
- Arrangements and plans for provision of contingent support in terms of business
 continuance and hand holding during the transition period, to MMPBY or its
 nominated agencies, and Replacement Operator for a reasonable period, so that
 the services provided continue and do not come to a halt.
- Each Exit Management Plan shall be presented by the selected bidder to and approved by MMPBY or its nominated agencies.

In the event of termination or expiry of SLA, Project Implementation, Operation and Management, each party shall comply with the Exit Management Plan..

Payments during the Exit Management period shall be made in accordance with the Terms of Payment Clause.

It would be the responsibility of the selected bidder to support new operator during the transition period.

2. Training, hand-holding, and knowledge transfer

The selected bidder shall hold technical knowledge transfer sessions with designated technical team of MMPBY participating departments in the last 3 months of the project duration.

3. Cooperation and Provision of Information during the exit management period

The selected bidder shall provide access to copies of all information held or controlled by them which they have prepared or maintained in accordance with the Project Implementation.

MMPBY or its nominated agencies shall be entitled to copy all such information comprising of details pertaining to the services rendered and other performance data. The selected bidder shall permit MMPBY or its nominated agencies and/ or any

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replacement operator to have reasonable access to its employees and facilities as reasonably required by MMPBY or its nominated agencies to understand the methods of delivery of the services employed by the selected bidder and to assist appropriate knowledge transfer.

4. Confidential Information, Security and Data

The selected bidder will promptly on the commencement of the exit management period supply toMMPBY or its nominated agencies the following:

All current and updated data as is reasonably required for purposes of MMPBY or its nominated agencies transitioning the services to its replacement selected bidder in a readily available format nominated by MMPBY or its nominated agencies; and

All other information (including but not limited to documents, records, and agreements) relating to the services reasonably necessary to enable MMPBY or its nominated agencies, or its replacement operator to carry out due diligence in order to transition the provision of the services to MMPBY or its nominated agencies, or its replacement operator (as the case may be).

Before the expiry of the exit management period, the selected bidder shall deliver to MMPBY or its nominated agencies all new or up-dated materials from the categories set out above and shall not retain any copies thereof, except that the selected bidder shall be permitted to retain one copy of such materials for archival purposes only.

5. Transfer of certain agreements

On request by Procuring entity or its nominated agencies, the selected bidder shall effect such assignments, transfers, innovations, licenses and sub-licenses as Procuring entity or its nominated agencies may require in favor of procuring entity or its nominated agencies, or its replacement operator in relation to any equipment lease, maintenance or service provisionagreement between selected bidder and third party leasers, operators, or operator, and which are related to the services and reasonably necessary for carrying out of the replacement services by MMPBY or its nominated agencies, or its replacement operator.

6. Right of Access to Premises:

At any time during the exit management period and for such period of time following termination or expiry of the SLA, where assets are located at the selected bidder's premises, the selected bidder will be obliged to give reasonable rights of access to (or, in the case of assets located on a third party's premises, procure reasonable rights of access to MMPBY or its nominated agencies, and/ or any replacement operator in order to inventory the assets.

7. General Obligations of the selected bidder

The selected bidder shall provide all such information as may reasonably be necessary to effect as seamless during handover as practicable in the circumstances to MMPBY or its nominated agencies or its replacement operator and which the operator has in its possession or control at any time during the exit management period.

The selected bidder shall commit adequate resources to comply with its obligations underthis Exit Management Clause.

Chapter-9

Appeals and Dispute Resolution

1. DISPUTE RESOULUTION

- 1.1. General: If any dispute arises between the supplier/ selected bidder and GIS during the execution of a contract that should be amicably settled by mutual discussions. However, if the dispute is not settled by mutual discussions, a written representation will be obtained from the supplier/ selected bidder on the points of dispute. The representation so received shall be examined by the concerned Procurement Committee which sanctioned the tender. The Procurement Committee may take legal advice of a counsel and then examine the representation. The supplier/ selected bidder will also be given an opportunity of being heard. The Committee will take a decision on the representation and convey it in writing to the selected bidder.
- 1.2. Standing Committee for Settlement of Disputes: If a question, difference or objection arises in connection with or out of the contract/ agreement or the meaning of operation of any part, thereof or the rights, duties or liabilities of either party have not been settled by mutual discussions or the decision of tender sanctioning Procurement Committee, it shall be referred to the empowered standing committee for decision. The empowered standing committee shall consist of following members: -

1.3. Procedure for reference to the Standing Committee: The selected bidder shall present his representation to the Director, SIPF (GIS) along with a fee equal to two percent of the amount of dispute, not exceeding Rupees One Lakh, within one month from the date of communication of decision of the tender sanctioning Procurement Committee. The officer-in-charge of the project who was responsible for monitoring services from the supplier/selected bidder shall prepare a reply of representation and shall represent the GIS stand before the standing committee. From the side of the supplier/selected bidder, the claim case may be presented by himself or through a lawyer. After hearing both the parties, the standing committee shall announce its decision which shall be final and binding both on the selected bidder and General Insurance fund.

2. GENERAL TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

- 2.1. The Mukyamantri Mangla Pashu Bima yojna is subject to amendment from time to time and BSA shall provide the administrative services accordingly.
- 2.2. The RFP document and any amendment thereto, scheme document (as defined in respective rules/schemes) any notification/orders/circulars regarding the scheme issued by the Government of Rajasthan will become integral part of this agreement (MOU).

3. OBLIGATIONS OF BSA

- The BSA shall set up a separate office according to bid document to provide BSA services to department.
- 3.2. The BSA shall maintain a helpdesk at the office of the Additional Director, State Insurance and SI&PF Department, (GIS) Room No. 201-B, IInd Floor, D-Block, Vitta Bhawan, Jyoti Nagar, Jaipur Rajasthan and representative of the BSA shall be available at the helpdesk during specified hours by the office. The representative managing the helpdesk shall receive all the claims received online and maintain its data and give the same to GIS office. BSA shall

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provide a telephone help line the cost of which shall be borne by the BSA. BSA shall provide E-mail address for receipt of information and other documents from beneficiary families.

3.3. Registration and Claims Processing Services:

- i. The BSA shall ensure reaching the site for the animal registration for the Insurance purposes and also conduct claim registration as and when required. All service requests will be settled on first in first out (FIFO) basis. The BSA shall ensure following FIFO for animal registration and claim registration.
- ii. The BSA will ensure following all the process mentioned in the bid document for animal registration and claim registration within prescribed time as mentioned in the bid document.
- iii. The BSA shall do the formalities for animal registration and claim registration online. Access to the portal will be provided to the BSA by the department
- 3.4. If there are any clerical or procedural shortcomings in the animal registration and claim registration, The BSA will seek correct information from beneficiary.

4. Responsibility of Collection of Data:

The Data of the successful beneficiaries through the lottery system will shared with the BSA, by SI&PF (GIS) Department, once received from the Animal husbandry Department.

Deficiencies in the required data: In case the data given to BSA does not comply with the requirement of the family detail and is not sufficient for the purpose of BSA services, the BSA will intimate the same to the GIS.

- iv. Legal cases and RTI cases shall be handled by GIS office. However, any report or assistance required by department will be provided within 3 days by BSA. Legal expenses shall be borne by

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the department. However, BSA will be responsible and accountable for decision of the court/information Commission. Any legal case arises, and payment is made to any beneficiary due to lacuna or default of BSA, the cost shall be borne by BSA only.

5.2. Code of Conduct of BSA:

- i. A BSA shall as far as possibly act in the best professional Manner.
- ii. In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the provision contained above, it shall be the duty of every BSA, its Chief Administrative Officer or Chief Executive Officer and its employees or representatives to ensure that code of conduct issued by IRDA are followed in letter and spirit.

5.3. Maintenance and Confidentiality of information:

- i. The BSA shall maintain proper records documents, evidence and books of all transactions carried out by it on behalf of GIS in terms of its agreement. 5.4. OBLIGATION OF MMPBY:

- BSA will establish its help desk at the office of the Additional Director, GIS for which sufficient space will be provided to the BSA.
- GIS shall provide access to BSA and to the beneficiary on portal so that claimant can know online claim status.
- iii. In consideration of the Services provided by BSA, the GIS shall pay to the BSA the Fees per as per agreement. Service charges will be payable on Quarterly basis.

15. ASSIGNMENTS

- 15.1. Neither party shall be entitled to assign its rights and/or obligations under this Agreement.
- 15.2. Subject to the foregoing this agreement shall be fully binding upon both the parties and will be enforceable by the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assignees.

16. ENTIRE AGREEMENTS

This agreement entered into between the GIS and the BSA represents the entire agreement between the parties and shall supersede and previous agreement or understanding between the parties in relation to matter covered hereby. In the event of a conflict between the provisional of this agreement and any previous like agreement or understanding, the provisional of the agreement shall prevail.

17. RELATIONSHIPS

17.1. The parties to this agreement are independent contractors. Neither party is an agent, representative or partner of the other party. Neither party shall have any right, power or authority to enter into any agreement or memorandum of understanding for or on behalf of, or incur any obligation or liability of, or to otherwise, bind, the other party.

- 17.2. This agreement shall not be interpreted or construed to create an association, agency, joint venture, collaboration or partnership between the parties of to impose any liability attributable to such relationship upon either party.
- 17.3. It is clarified that neither the BSA nor its employees, Network providers or associated consultants or sub-contractor shall be deemed to be the employees of the SI&PF Deptt. (GIS) for any purpose whatsoever.

18. AMENDMENT

The general clause/ clauses of this agreement can be amended on mutual agreement.

19. NOTICES

Any notices given under or in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and in English/Hindi Language. Notice may be given, by being delivered to the address of the addressee (in which case the notice shall be deemed to be served at the time of delivery) by email/courier services or by fax (in which case the original shall be sent by courier services).

Filing an Appeal
